Dear Resident:

A public input meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 15 to discuss the early design associated with proposed improvements to the nearly one-mile stretch of 31st Avenue SE, from Broadway to 13th Street SE. You are receiving this letter as the proposed 2020 construction will take place in front of, or near your property. The project is scheduled to transform this roadway from a two-lane rural roadway to a three-lane concrete urban arterial road.

The open house meeting is scheduled from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in the cafeteria of the John Hoeven Elementary School, 3400 13th Street SE. The meeting will be an opportunity for residents and business owners to provide input on proposed improvements to 31st Avenue SE itself, the walking path near the road, intersections along the route, water drainage in the area and how the project could be phased, in order to mitigate impact to the neighborhood. A formal presentation will begin at 7 that will include some early design elements and options that are under consideration.
